

KNOW YOUR RIGHTS

IF YOU ARE SUMMONED BY POLICE/ PROSECUTORS' OFFICE:

Police or the prosecutor's office, have no right to summon you for the purpose of interrogation. They can only summon you just for the purpose of interviewing.

If an investigator from the police or prosecutor's office summons you for an interview as a witness, whether through a phone call or any other means of communication, you have the right to decide whether to comply or disregard the summons. You also have the right to be informed about the subject matter for which you are being summoned by the investigative body. However, it's essential to note that this right does not apply when you are summoned as a witness by the court.

If you choose to appear as a witness for an interview at the police or prosecutor's office, it's important to be aware that the interviewee cannot be compelled to disclose information or provide evidence. The police officer or investigator conducting the interview is obligated to communicate to the interviewee that the interview is voluntary. Consequently, even if you attend as a witness before the investigative body, you retain the right to refuse the interview and withhold information regarding the subject under investigation.

Since appearing and consenting to an interview is voluntary, you have the right to decline an interview without the presence of your defense lawyer. It is within your rights to appear with your defense lawyer at a time that is convenient for you.
